## *Behold, I Stand at the Door and Knock*

The days of Advent are upon us! Advent – those four weeks which precede the feast of Christmas – are days of preparation. They are a time to get to our houses in order for impending celebrations. And they are a time to get our hearts ready for the One who comes to us at Christmas. Advent is a time to remember both how God came to earth in Jesus and how the risen Jesus will one day come back to earth to fully, perfectly establish His eternal kingdom.

When I think of Advent – the season and its meaning – words authored by the German Lutheran Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer often come to mind. Bonhoeffer, who was martyred in the waning days of World War II for his opposition to Na-zism, noted in part:

*Our whole life is an Advent, a time of waiting for the ultimate, for the time when there will be a new heaven and a new earth, when all people will be brothers and sisters.*

*It is very remarkable that we face the thought that God is coming so calmly. We have become so accustomed to the idea of divine love and of God's coming at Christmas that we no longer feel the shiver of fear that God's coming should arouse in us. We are indifferent to the message, taking only the pleasant and agreeable out of it and forgetting the serious aspect, that the God of the world draws near to the people of our little earth and lays claim to us. The coming of God is truly not only glad tidings, but first of all frightening news for everyone who has a conscience.*

*Only when we have felt the terror of the matter, can we recognize the incom-parable kindness. God comes into the very midst of evil and of death, and judges the evil in us and in the world. And by judging us, God cleanses and sanctifies us, comes to us with grace and love. God makes us happy as only children can be happy.*

*God wants to always be with us, wherever we may be – in our sin, in our suffering and death. We are no longer alone; God is with us. We are no longer homeless; a bit of the eternal home itself has moved unto us. Therefore we adults can rejoice deeply within our hearts under the Christmas tree, perhaps much more than the children are able. We know that God's goodness will once again draw near. We think of all of God's goodness that came our way last year and sense something of this marvelous home. Jesus comes in judgment and grace: "Behold I stand at the door! Open wide the gates!" (Ps. 24:7)*

May your days of Advent waiting be filled with the angelic promise: "On earth peace to those on whom God's favor rests."

## First Wine Tasting of 2011!

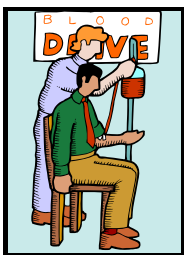

Our special guests were our missionaries, Dr. Dennis and Paul Lofstrom from the Nyakato Health Center in Tanzania. They were greeted by about 60 HSLC members and friends sitting at Africana-decorated tables and a big array of delectable food dishes. The evening was enhanced by the traditional Tanzanian dancing of Aneth Ngatosa accompanied by an excellent drummer. Beautiful Tanzanian crafts were available for sale, the profits from which will be used to purchase a surgical bed. Generous donations were given as well.

Paula Lofstrom gave us a full, encouraging, and challenging up-to-date report on the progress of the new hospital at Nyakato, aided by a colorful Power Point presentation. We were gripped by the realization that this ministry is not only saving lives through medical treatment but is also changing the way life-threatening tribal superstitions are challenged and changed.

The mission of the Heritage Fund is to enhance and extend the life and mission of Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church and its religious, educational and charitable work both within HSLC and in the local community. The Fund is a vehicle to accept gifts, bequests (including designated gifts \$5,000 or greater) and other forms of charitable contributions.



The Heritage Fund has grown this year through several significant gifts to over \$100,000. It is fully invested in conservative mutual funds. 5% of the value of the Fund will be used each year on mission expenditures recommended by the Heritage Fund Advisory Board and approved by the Church Council. The Board and Pastor Valentine are currently working on a plan for a speaker's series focused on parenting and open to the entire community which will be funded by the money available from the Fund this year.
