
# WHOM SHALL I FEAR? For the Lord is my light and my salvation



PJ's Book Club is scheduled to meet and discuss John Danforth's book The Relevance of Religion on the evening of Tuesday, March 13th in the Center for Ministry at Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church at 7:00 p.m. (You can currently obtain a copy through Amazon, local bookstores or the Contra Costa County Library.)

As you read and prepare for our conversation:

- THINK BEFORE READING! We live in a nation that asserts a clear separation between church and state. But the Bible makes claims about how we ought live as a human community. What – to you – is the current role of religion in our politics? What – to you – is the proper role?
- NOTE WHILE READING! Keep a running list of:
  - + 'aha's things you learned that you didn't know before
  - + 'amen's your points of agreement with the author
  - + 'no way's your points of disagreement with the author
  - + 'hmm's things you'd like to consider further
- PONDER! Danforth proposes a new model for bipartisanship in our nation and a different role for religion in the political realm than that which is currently operative. Whether you agree with his perspective or not, he invites us all to consider how our faith and our politics intersect. How might The Relevance of Religion challenge you to reevaluate how faith and politics intersect in your life?

About the Author: John Danforth graduated from Princeton University, Yale Divinity School, and Yale Law School. An ordained Episcopal priest, Danforth practiced law in New York City and St. Louis before serving as attorney general of Missouri, United States senator from Missouri, and United States representative to the United Nations. Danforth officiated the funeral service of former president Ronald Reagan in 2004 and that of Washington Post executive Katharine Graham in 2001, both at the National Cathedral.

**Read:** "Jesus Raises Lazarus" (John 11:1-44)

**Recite:** Jesus said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" — John 11:25-26

**Reflect:** This week's reading tells us that – upon receiving the news that Lazarus was sick – Jesus returned to Bethany. In the meantime, Lazarus died. Even though Jesus ends up saving Lazarus from death, Jesus cried. Do you know anyone who has recently died? How did you feel? What comfort does Jesus bring in the face of death and distance and despair?

**Pray:** God of the Resurrection, create in us new life. You gave breath to Lazarus, and we ask that you fill us with the same breath of life. In the midst of our daily routines, instill in us your Holy Spirit — that we might share our lives with others. Amen

Invitations to be mailed March 21 and ticket sales for dinner/raffle prizes will be offered following worship starting March 25. We hope to see you at the Fiesta!



1 yellow or white cake mix 1 lg. vanilla instant pudding 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese - softened 2 T milk

20 oz. can crushed pineapple, drained

12 oz. cool whip (1 ½ tubs)

1 cup white coconut

1 cup chopped walnuts or almonds

Mix cake as on package and put in greased large 17 x 11 x 1 inch jelly roll pan. Bake 20-25 minutes at 350 degrees

Make pudding and then mix with softened cream cheese. Spread over cooled cake.

Spread pineapple over pudding. Spread cool whip over pineapple and sprinkle with coconut and nuts.

Refrigerate. Leftovers freeze well. Serves 20-24.
