

February 26 - March 4, 2018

Read: "Peter's Denial" (John 18:12-27)

Recite: Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed. — *John 18:27*

Reflect: John indicates that Peter denied being a follower of Jesus because he was scared what might happen to him. Have you ever found yourself denying your involvement in something for fear of being caught? Did you do it because you were scared what might happen to you? What are some other ways in which fear takes a toll on our lives and makes us do things of which we are not proud?

Pray: Lord, Just like Peter, we are sometimes not faithful. Just like Peter, we sometimes struggle to follow you. Just like Peter, we sometimes gather around the fire to stay warm. Help us each day, Lord, to be faithful to you. Amen.
