For Next Week - Sunday, November 18

Read: "Swords into Plowshares" (Isaiah 36:1-3, 13-20; 37:1-7; 2:1-4)

Recite: "Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more." — Isaiah 2:4b

Reflect:

- The old saying "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me" is a saying that many of us grew up with. Likewise the expression "The pen is mightier than the sword." Which of those pieces of popular wisdom seems more true to you today? How have 'mere words' injured you recently? How did 'mere words' injure King Hezekiah?
- King Hezekiah is afraid of the Assyrian army camped around Jerusalem, threatening to destroy the city. He goes to the prophet Isaiah for advice, and Isaiah tells Hezekiah not to be afraid and to trust in God. Tell about a time you were afraid. Who encouraged you?
- Speech writers and public speakers have used Isaiah's images of swords and plowshares to great effect. Consider what President Ronald Reagan once said while addressing the UN: "Cannot swords be turned to plowshares? Can we and all nations not live in peace? In our obsession with antagonisms of the moment, we often forget how much unites all the members of humanity. Perhaps we need some outside, universal threat to make us recognize this common bond. I occasionally think how quickly our differences world-wide would vanish if we were facing an alien threat from outside this world. And yet, I ask you, is not an alien force already among us? What could be more alien than war and the threat of war?" In what way do President Reagan's words reflect the spirit of the Prophet Isaiah?

Pray: God of Peace — Inspire in our hearts a longing for peace. Cause nations to beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. And where we are able to bring peace to our world, grant us the will and the ability. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
