A Calming Prayer for Every Feeling

Exhausted? Upset? Frustrated? Offended? Confused? There's a prayer for that. by Bob Hostetler (from Guideposts)

"When I am afraid, I will trust in You" (Psalm 56:3, NIV 1984). I have prayed countless versions of that verse. It adapts easily and succinctly to any and every situation I encounter and every emotion I feel. Here are some examples that you can incorporate into your prayers:

Someone or something upsets you: "When I am angry, I will trust in You."

Your schedule (or life) seems to spin out of control: "When I am stressed, I will trust in You."

Someone offends or hurts you: "When I am hurt, I will trust in You."

Your physical, mental or emotional resources run out: "When I am exhausted, I will trust in You."

Comparisons with others assail you: "When I feel insecure, I will trust in You."

You lose someone or something: "When I am grieving, I will trust in You."

Loneliness strikes: "When I am lonely, I will trust in You."

You're having trouble waiting for someone or something: "When I am impatient, I will trust in You."

Someone lashes out: "When I am under attack, I will trust in You."

You're confused: "When I don't know what to do, I will trust in You."

See how well it works? And those are just a start. This Psalm 56:3 prayer can be adapted to practically any emotion or situation. Try it, and adapt it to your need-of-the-moment, in every moment.

From Jesse Kitundu, Medical Director of the Children's Hospital at Zinga

I thank all of those who took their time to come to Zinga and see what we are doing.

The months of May and June are when the rainy season ends and the weather becomes cooler. The cool weather extends up to August when the early rains start again. The end of the rainy season means there are fewer patients as compared to the rainy season. Our roads also inhibit access to the hospital during the rainy season, so there is an impact then, also on the number of patients who can make it to be seen. This limits the number and variety of patients experienced by some of our visiting medical students and residents. We're hoping in the future, and with our now being approved to receive the national health insurance we anticipate that the patient numbers will increase significantly.

The project is progressing as well as the services to patients. We are so grateful for the doctors, farmers, mechanics, and other experts who have come to share their areas of expertise with us.

Another Challenge Grant for IHP! Christmas in July!! Dr. Christine Petersen is again offering a Christmas in July Challenge grant of \$15,000 to finish the Mary Ellen Kitundu Memorial Birthing Center.
