Social Ministry Update:'Winter Nights' Homeless Shelter

We're helping out with the 'Winter Nights' shelter program this February. Maybe you'll be able to help!

Manda worked full time. After 17 year of marriage she found herself dealing with divorce, raising two teenagers and struggling to pay rent. This was not the future she had planned. Then one of her children became sick. Spiraling medical bills ensued and she lost her home. For three years, Manda and her children the family couch surfed, lived out of their car and in motels. Then they found the Winter Nights shelter. A safe warm place to sleep, a place to shower, warm food and a caring network of staff and volunteers who could reassure her, encourage her and give her hope and strength. Tutors helped her children stay up to date at school. Staff worked along side her to assist with sorting out debt, schedules, and legal problems. By the spring she had saved enough money to move out of the shelter and rent a small apartment close by. She is hopeful and appreciative of the support she received at Winter Nights, saying, "It gives you a chance to breathe. It's a hand that holds you up so you can take care of what you need to."

The week of February 5-10 is Holy Shepherd's week to aid in Winter Nights this year! Partnering with Orinda Community Church and St. Perpetua Catholic Church in Lafayette, we're working to support hurting families like Manda's. There are a number of opportunities to get involved including donating specific items for meals as well as cash to purchase needed items. Volunteers are also needed to help with preparing / serving / cleaning up after dinner. The 'Winter Nights' shelter program was started in 2004 by a consortium of faith communities — including Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church — as a way to protect homeless families by providing shelter in a clean and safe environment and to help families break the homelessness cycle by assisting them into stable housing.

For the past decade we have partnered with Orinda Community Church and St Perpetua's Catholic Church to co-host the shelter as it rotates thoughout Contra Costa County. Additionally, "Winter Nights" is a regular recipient of our congregation's "Giving Beyond Ourselves" financial support.

Parsonage News

One of our congregation's most significant tangible assets is our parsonage, located at 1107 Sanders Drive in Moraga (that's just down the street from Pastor John's home.) Built in 1961, the house is 1,581 sq.ft, 4 bedrooms, 2 baths,



hardwood floors, AC, and private back yard. Although showing its age at 60 years, it has an upgraded kitchen, replaced roof, and the interior has been freshly painted.

The house was acquired by Holy Cross Lutheran Church of Moraga which was established in 1969. In 1993, with the merger of Holy Cross in Moraga and Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in Orinda, the parsonage became part of the new entity, Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church. The sanctuary property in Moraga was sold to Growing Tree Preschool; the preschool is still in that location.

Over the years, the parsonage has provided a comfortable home for at least four pastors and their families (Pastors Wolkenhauer, Hughes, Valentine and Serrano). When not used for clergy housing, it has been rented. The last tenants moved out in July, 2021 after four years of residence. The parsonage is currently rented to a young family.

Realizing that satisfactory maintenance of the parsonage property has been inconsistent over the years, it is the goal of the new Parsonage Management Team to maintain it in a manner consistent with the care of our church property in Orinda as well as with the neighborhood location in Moraga. Over a two-month period last summer, a dedicated group of volunteers donated their time and resources to improvements at the property.
