

PRESCHOOL TRANSFORMATION BEGINS

At a meeting of the congregation in December 2022, we authorized substantive expansion of our preschool facilities in Gregersen Hall so as to accommodate a new preschool ministry program known as "Holy Shepherd Community Preschool". This month we'll begin experiencing some of the growing pains related to that development.

"Making this transition work is going to require flexibility on ALL our parts," congregational Vice-President Joan Kiekhaefer noted recently. "But it's looking like we're going to be able to get this done, and get it done more quickly than we originally has hoped."

- Tom Gilbertson has worked with our architect (Chris Gilman) to develop a remodel plan that minimizes both building costs and construction time, yet aligns with state licensing requirements and our projected program needs.
- Our general contractor (Todd Bifulco) is working hard to create a work schedule that expedites construction while minimizing disruptions to our LARC program staff and participants.
- Our own Preschool team (led by the amazing Ms. Amy) continues to be abundantly flexible in terms of schedules and spaces and demands on their time.

Now it is also time for ALL of us to be flexible as we temporarily convert some of our Center for Ministry space into multiple-use space until the preschool renovations are completed — so thanks in advance for being patient and flexible!

- The CFM Chapel has temporarily been converted into a soft-seating conversation space.
- The CFM Women's Restroom will (on school days) become a preschool restroom.
- The CFM Main Hall will (on school days) become primary classroom space for our expanded preschool student population.
- Gregersen Hall will be 'off-limits' to all except our LARC and Preschool participants and staff.

Sundays at 10am — Sunday School for Kids happens twice-monthly following KidTalk. (Next class dates are April 16 and April 30)


Sundays at 10:30 am — Coffee Fellowship takes place following our in-person worship service

A Word from Pastor John

It's Friday ... but Sunday's coming!



It was a now-anonymous African-American preacher that intoned one of the memorable sermons of all time. A simple sermon actually. It started softly, and then built in volume and intensity until the entire congregation was completely engaged. The theme (and the refrain) of that sermon was "It's Friday ... but Sunday's coming!" I LOVE that message — for that is the heart of the message which Christians celebrate throughout the world this week!

It was Friday, and Jesus was put on trial. False witnesses were brought forth. The crowd chose Barabbas. Pilate washed his hands. It was Friday ... but Sunday's coming. Then again, maybe it's Friday for you too. Maybe you've been lied to, told you are no good, unloved and unwanted. It may be Friday for you too, but take heart, for Sunday's coming.

It was Friday. They placed the cross on his shoulders and made him carry it through the streets of the Holy City. The crowd jeered him and mocked him and made his journey all the harder. It was Friday ... but Sunday's coming. Then again, maybe it's Friday for you too. Pressures of the job or the home wearing down on you.
